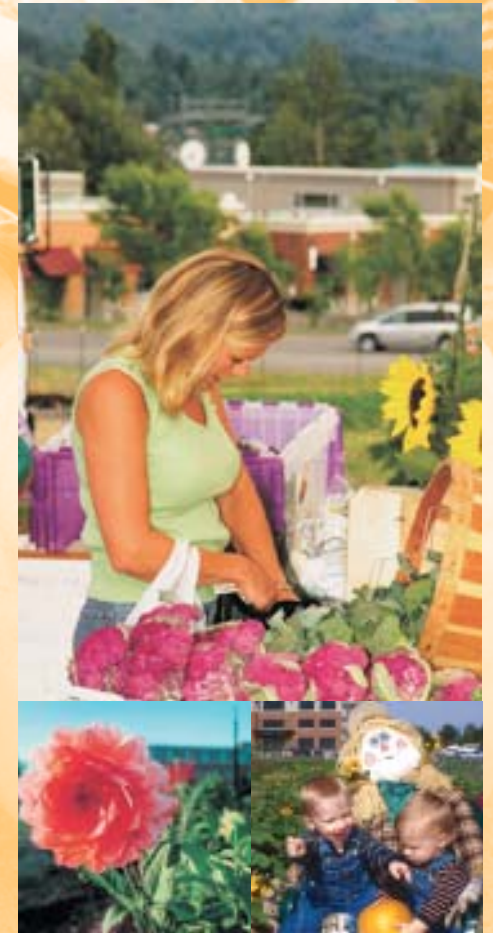

A traffic light will be installed this fall, at the corner of Newmarket Street and Barkley Boulevard. With the success of Barkley Village's retailers, the growing office presence to the north, and the surrounding residential growth, the intersection has become increasingly busy.

### Barkley Autumn Trail Run & Festival

The Barkley Autumn Festival and Trail Run will return on October 18, 2003. The day will start with an 8K run and 3K walk that will loop along Barkley Boulevard and the railroad trail. The new Alabama overpass will allow participants to run the entire course without crossing any streets. Registration and race packet hand-out will take place in a tent near the Barkley Pumpkin Patch beginning at 8:30 a.m., and the 10:00 a.m. run and walk will start and finish in Barkley Village, under the clock-tower.



The rest of the day will feature a host of activities centered around the Barkley Pumpkin Patch, including live music, food and refreshments, an inflatable play structure, pumpkin sales, "train" rides through the Patch, games for children, and more. Pumpkins will be on sale at the Patch from October 13-31.

Local garden enthusiast and volunteer extraordinaire, Sal Vacca, has once again coordinated the planting and growing of Barkley's 2-acre Pumpkin Patch, as well as the dahlias that have been sold by donation throughout the summer.
